A LETTER FROM BILL

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As I reflect on the year 2021 and the ministry of Coracle, I'm amazed and a bit shocked. The year 2020 was so challenging for all of us, and God was so faithful. This past year has continued to be so challenging for all of us, and God (of course) has been faithful still! Coracle has continued to grow as we've sought to respond to more and more people who are somehow encountering God through our offerings. We often pray, "Lord, lead to us who you want to meet through us," and God keeps answering that prayer, abundantly!

In a year marked for many by uncertainty, weariness, and weakness, it seems Coracle has gone from strength to strength, even if we've at times felt uncertain, weary, and weak ourselves! In most ways we have grown so significantly it almost feels like we're a different organization.

And actually, we are. The lessons learned from 2020 and the new ways we've discovered to offer ministry have meant that this year has seen our biggest programs ever and more people than ever before benefitting from what God is doing through us. The following pages tell those stories. And while our whole team has worked really hard, it truly is a testimony to God's work. It's been evident that it has been God working *through* us even as our own mission is exactly that: *"To inspire and enable people to be the presence of God in the brokenness of the world through Spiritual Formation* for *Kingdom Action."*

The Coracle Fellowship expanded my vision of what it meant to be an apprentice of Jesus, leading me to more fully understand God's heart for justice, the poor, needy, oppressed... AND His invitation for me to be His hands and feet in the world. As my heart and vision continued to expand, I began to wonder how I could live this out in my community, so I joined the outreach ministry at my church. After serving on this team for some time, I put together a proposal (which served as my Coracle Fellowship Final Project) suggesting how the current outreach ministries at the church could be strengthened and expanded, in hopes that the church community more fully lives out Isaiah 1:17 -> "Seek justice, encourage the oppressed, defend the cause of the fatherless, plead the case of the widow."



Will Rowe (Corhaven '20)

I joined the Coracle Fellowship to get clarity on my future vocation as I move into my mid-60s. **The program was a refresh and brought truth, relationships, and vocation to the surface for me.** In short, Kingdom Action, a major theme of the Fellowship, surfaced and helped renew my call to peacemaking and reconciliation in my local context. This culminated in my Capstone project for the Fellowship Program -- a Racial Reconciliation Seminar, "**Gathering in Humility to Listen, Learn, and Serve**," which featured 18 speakers and included close to 150 participants from 51 churches across the country in January of this year. I am grateful for all who were involved in the Seminar and how the Fellowship Program experience encouraged me in this work.



Stories of God at Work

BALTIMORE



We have delighted in the work of "Spiritual Formation *for* Kingdom Action" this year in Baltimore. The **Coracle Fellowship in Baltimore** continues to flourish, with 55 fellows traveling together in deep transformation. We offered the largest **open retreat** in our history with 60 participants joining us for Advent. We have also grown in the number of **spiritual directors and directees** served.

In engaging our community we have raised nearly \$20,000 to help fund **Hope Garden**, a garden for prayer and reflection in the heart of the historic Sandtown-Winchester neighborhood. It was a sincere joy to transition back to in-person ministry over the course of 2021 in NoVA. Monthly **Coracle Community Gatherings** offered an alternative space for folks who wanted a small group focused on quiet and deep listening. An unexpected blessing was our contemplative journey through season 1 of **The Chosen**; many of those who gathered said Jesus felt real, tangible to them- that their faith was infused with "feeling" that they hadn't ever experienced. Finally, we had the privilege of offering **three open retreats** this fall in NoVA- each an intimate gathering intended to help us connect with God in unique and refreshing ways. I am thrilled to discover what the Lord has in store for us in 2022!

SHENANDOAH VALLEY

While a number of things could be highlighted regarding 2021 in the Valley (Creation Care Retreat, Artist Collective, Advent Concert etc.), one of the themes that surprised us has been Coracle's ability to facilitate meaningful conversations among pastors and ministry leaders. Much of this focus initially began to take shape through our Spring initiative "An American Lent: Pastoral Foundations" with over 20 ministry leaders from different denominations engaging conversations around racial justice. Since that time, a number of pastors have asked us to continue playing a similar role engaging numerous topics, and we hope to continue hosting "Pastors' Roundtable Discussions" to help promote church unity in the Valley.



CORHAVEN

Our 17-acre retreat home in the Shenandoah Valley was a truly special place for rest and restoration for many during this long and challenging season. We were so grateful to re-open this space to individual retreatants, small groups, and even a few larger group gatherings, like our Creation Care Camp and Taste of Sabbath events this summer.

Under the leadership of Patty Prasada-Rao, the online version of the devotional was able to add some stunning artwork from African American painters and sculptors to enhance the experience of this transformative journey. Over the summer, the **Leadership Team agreed to make Repentance Project an official part of Coracle's ministry** and to migrate the American Lent/Lament devotionals to the wonderful folks at Arrabon. We look forward to hiring a full-time Repentance Project Director in 2022 who will help us discern what is next for this good work of God!

How We're Growing


INTO 2022

In 2019, our board and staff completed a "Year of Strategic Discernment." Wanting to faithfully steward what God was doing through this work, it felt only responsible to get a bit more focused and think longer-range about the ministry precisely so that more people could be ministered to. You know what happened in 2020.

Having picked up the task again in 2021, our board recently voted to adopt a three-year strategy to 1) strengthen our existing programs, 2) develop new resources to meet emerging needs, and 3) build the operational infrastructure to support the pace of growth we've been experiencing.

This will take many forms. This coming year we are focusing our efforts on...

- Significantly expanding the Coracle Fellows Program, whether physically or digitally or both.
- Getting "Essential Christianity" into a form that is most effective and replicable and make it available to as many people as possible.
- **Coming alongside church congregations** to offer what they feel is especially needful that matches what we are the most good at providing, and adapting some of our existing content into different forms so it can be more available and useful to more groups.
- Significantly ramping up the Repentance Project's efforts towards racial healing by hiring a fulltime director to generate new programs and initiatives, as well as to help ensure that Coracle's many efforts towards this goal are well coordinated and integrated.
- Strengthen all of Coracle's community initiatives in **Northern Virginia/DC**, **Baltimore**, and the **Shenandoah Valley**, and discern new regions to grow into as God leads.
- Increase our ministries of **spiritual direction** and the retreat ministry of **Corhaven**, including clarifying more cohesive initiatives around creation care.
- **Enhance our online presence** and resources to make them easily findable and most accessible
- **Increase the diversity of our ministry** at every level- board, staff, and spiritual directors.
- And as always, **keep on listening to God** for whatever else or new God might have us do. This has always been the way Coracle has grown the most and most creatively, by listening to God and then being faithful to respond.
