From the Executive Director

Friends, I write this early in Advent, the first season in a new Church year. Together all of us are preparing to celebrate the Incarnation of God in Jesus Christ.

As you'll read about in the following pages, we are focused on building the **Coracle Community** and growing **The Coracle Center of Formation** for **Action**. - Formation living as new persons in Jesus Christ, as our true selves in God and in the world.
- Kingdom Action living in and bringing Shalom more fully into the world for the sake of others and all creation, presenting the Gospel, and pursuing beauty, diversity, and justice as hallmarks of the Kingdom of God.
- Community living connected, authentic and meaningful lives with each other; offering hospitality and sharing life with others, especially those whom God leads to us.

Coracle's Why

Since we started our journey in 2012, Coracle has been constantly motivated by two inescapable truths - that the world is broken and that Jesus is real. In light of these truths, over the years we have worked hard to enable people to significantly deepen their relationships to God so that they might find new life in Jesus, and powerfully engage places of brokenness in the world with God's redemptive love.

As we look around us now, we see Christians tired, worn out and in need of renewal, and in response we create spaces that encourage them to draw close to Jesus. We grieve as we see an expression of the church that too often obscures Jesus instead of making him real and known to all, and in response we create safe spaces for dialogue and renewal. We see a world of the seeking and the broken, and in response we create spaces for belonging, vulnerability, honesty, and encounters with God.

As from the beginning,

- We help the mature mature.
- We help those longing for More find it.
- We help those looking for God to find God and be found.
- We help those engaging the brokenness of the world find connection and strength to keep engaging.

- We bring God's Kingdom with so many others, working for justice, reconciliation, and shalom for all people.
- We help people be who God has made them to be for the good of all people, the common good, and the good of the world.

We help others live more deeply into the deepest invitation of the Christian faith. Since the first centuries of the Christian church and across the Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant spectrum, noteworthy leaders have made the same, stunning assertion. C.S. Lewis puts it this way: "Every Christian is to become a little Christ. The whole purpose of becoming a Christian is simply nothing else." He continues, "This is the whole of Christianity. There is nothing else. The Church exists for nothing else but to draw people into Christ, to make them little Christs...God became man for no other purpose."

That's what Coracle is about most fundamentally: helping each other say a loud "Yes!" to the invitation to share in the life of Jesus while we're in the world - to incarnate the Incarnation - and share the love of Jesus to this beautiful and broken world, for the glory of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit. To this end, we desire to be and to build community, particularly creating spaces for encounters with God that encourage contemplation (for spiritual formation) and action (for justice and shalom). We do this through our various expressions of The Coracle Community and through The Coracle Center of Formation for Action.

The Coracle Community

Coracle is an ecumenical community committed to contemplation, formation, and Kingdom action. We are fellow pilgrims pursuing union with God and deeper life in Jesus together for Love's sake in the world. All are welcome to be part of our community to the extent they desire to engage, online or in person, through our various offerings.

- The Coracle Community in Northern Virginia gathers regularly on Sunday nights at the Coracle Center in Arlington, VA, for companionship, personal deepening, worship, Gospel reading, prayer, and Eucharist.
- We are working to form an ecumenical, short to mid-term residential community guided by the Benedictine tradition with rhythms of work, study, and prayer. This Coracle Community at Corhaven welcomes those seeking rest and renewal through the spiritual discipline of retreat. As Coracle's retreat center in the Shenandoah Valley, Corhaven focuses on ministries of hospitality and spiritual retreat, creation care and spirituality, and racial justice and reconciliation.
- The Coracle Community Online provides spaces for gathering regularly for conversation, companionship, retreat, and prayer for people across the country and around the world.
- Some among the Coracle Community choose to practice A Common Way, our version of
 a way of life together that makes the wisdom and practices of the monastic tradition
 accessible to normal people in the modern world in the concrete circumstances and
 constraints of our daily lives to which God has called us.

The Coracle Center of Formation for Action

In 2025, Coracle launched an ecumenical Center of Formation for Action in the Washington, DC metro area. At the Coracle Center, we create opportunities for encounters with God and provide ministries of formation, healing, and action.

We consider Coracle's offerings even more crucial for this moment in which American culture is increasingly divided and Christian witness in America greatly damaged, as again and again, we see:

- many people suffering wounding and disillusionment by the church in America;
- many people feeling disturbed, anxious, exhausted, and disoriented; and
- many lovers of God like "sheep without a shepherd" (Mk 6.34).

One of the ways Coracle seeks to shine lights into this moment is to lean into our vision of helping people come fully alive through Christ for the sake of the world.

To create space for this, the Center's offerings occur in a variety of forms, both in person and online, including:

- The Coracle Spiritual Formation Fellowship Program
- Weekly prayer and Eucharist services
- Dedicated spaces for spiritual direction and personal retreat
- Topically themed group retreats and cohorts
- Learning and reflection opportunities, including seminars, lectures, and crucial conversations
- Justice offerings and advocacy, including the Repentance Project
- Local and global pilgrimages
- Publishing written works and digital resources that encourage spiritual formation for Kingdom action, including: the "For The Journey" podcast, the Coracle online "Journal," the Center's YouTube channel, Coracle's "Essential Christianity" course, and Bill Haley's "Thoughts Along the Way" Substack
- Supporting our network of Spiritual Directors, Coracle Associates, and Coracle Chapters

The Coracle Fellowship Spiritual Formation Program leads participants through a series of 12 retreats to go deeper in their relationships with God in order to be a redemptive presence in the world.





The "Essential Christianity" course is a book, video, and audio course designed to help participants recover the awe of Jesus and Christianity, available for individual, small group, and church use.

The Repentance Project pursues racial healing and reconciliation among all peoples by offering programs to encourage Christians to recognize, repent, and respond to America's history of racial injustice for the sake of repair and in the context of relationships.





Space for God creates space online for encounters with God through a variety of ancient and modern contemplative prayer practices, with weekly virtual offerings in different time zones.

Coracle's Spiritual Direction network of 45 directors offers the classic Christian ministry of spiritual accompaniment for a wide variety of people, with scholarships available to broaden accessibility.





Pilgrimages and Mission trips provide transformative travel experiences including Maryland and Virginia slavery history sites, Guatemala and the US/ Mexico Border, the Camino de Santiago in Spain, Celtic Christianity in the UK, Israel/Palestine, and Rome and Assisi.



Food for the Journey: Weekly prayer and Eucharist services; topically themed group retreats and cohorts; urban and rural retreat spaces and opportunities.

Encouragement for the Journey: written works and digital resources that encourage spiritual formation for Kingdom action, including our "For The Journey" podcast, the Coracle online "Journal," the Center's YouTube channel, Coracle's "Essential Christianity" course, and the "Thoughts Along the Way" Substack.

Expanding the Mission

Coracle Chapters

Since 2016, Coracle has had a vibrant ministry presence in Baltimore with many offerings and an engaged community. To enable even more ministry and give greater flexibility to discern and respond to God's invitations there, "Coracle Baltimore" will launch as the very first "Coracle Chapter" in 2026. While still closely connected, Coracle Baltimore will forward the mission, vision, and values of Coracle distinctly in that city for the sake of many more people.

We remain curious to see if there are other places that would benefit from being a Coracle Chapter - a local, unique expression of this ministry.

Coracle Spiritual Directors and Associates

Since the beginning, Coracle has supported a network of trained **Spiritual Directors**, those called to companion others on the journey by offering a listening, prayerful presence. We began with two spiritual directors and now have over 45 offering this particular form of ministry.

For over 10 years, Coracle has enabled those with other unique ministry expressions and vocations to offer those in a way that is supported by our non-profit infrastructure and status, joining us as **Coracle Associates**. In this way Coracle functions as "a mission agency for spiritual entrepreneurs". We anticipate enabling even more people's vocations as Coracle Associates, and by virtue of that provide even more ministries of formation and action.
