## Thoughts on the difference between Acceptance (or glad surrender), which looks up in faith, and Resignation, which looks down in despair

**acceptance** is usually accompanied by relief.... it is what it is *resignation* is usually accompanied by bitterness.... I hate what it is

**acceptance** comes on bended knee, with open hands *resignation* comes with tightly clenched jaws and fists

**acceptance** is gentle with self and with others, it is trusting *resignation* is harsh with self and with others, it is resentful

**acceptance** is faith-filled, even hopeful, that better days are ahead *resignation* is faithless, often despairing, anticipating bleakness and pain

**acceptance** is believing that despite the harsh conditions, the seed will flower *resignation* is believing that the seed has no life, or is a flowerless weed

**acceptance** does not mean living with that which is changeable, for love demands dignity *resignation* often means living with the unacceptable, as twisted love is enabling

**acceptance** does not mean not changing the things that can be changed *resignation* means surrendering hopelessly to things as they are, even if changeable

**acceptance** means dependence on God for moment by moment wisdom *resignation* means independence from God and rigid or harsh thinking

**acceptance** means love plus truth and justice *resignation* means love without truth and justice

**acceptance** means clear sight and living in reality *resignation* means clouded sight and living in unreality

**acceptance** is usually validated by others *resignation* is usually challenged by others

acceptance connects resignation disengages

acceptance is faith-filled *resignation* despairs.

Lord, help us to know what to accept and what not to accept, and keep us from bitter resignation if change is possible.
